

Map made - compass map of all features  
on lot made in transit

Feature I - at ca 1.74 below a layer  
of mortar over coquina rubble appears  
(10 cm below ground surface) extends as  
a footing west of kitchen building  
foundation, then ends. At the ending  
point, a water pipe can be discerned just  
below the surface - may have disturbed  
foundation / floor. West of this point  
is a zone of hard packed earth and

shell, coquina etc - 1.80 - possibly  
a floor area - This extends the  
length of the trench except for  
a small area in the SW corner.

floor cut & profiled between  
stakes SON 50.9E & SON 50E  
at 2.04 bd - some small blocks

profile from 50W 50E —

second floor level appears in profile - does not extend into kitchen wall, although this may be the result of a building trench for the present kitchen building.

The area mapped in just E of stake 50W 48E of coquina & rubble bottom out at —

(coquina area - closed at 1.88)

This may well have been part of the western extension of the floor revealed at 1.79 - probably was part of 19<sup>th</sup> century porch - tramps printed pebbles & red brick found in this coquina area

Have abandoned screening until next floor level is reached - at 2.01

between stakes 50W 48.5E and 50W 50E light brown soil appears in a distinct

line at 2.0 bd - may be pipe trench  
or may be upper level of old  
grade level sloping downwards from  
East to West

a black soil, trench-like area

3 probable potholes appear extending

have excavated this in the West

end to 125 cm below ground  
surface without reaching sterile -  
St. Johns & San Marcos Ceramics  
present at this trench - seems to  
be from an earlier Indian occupation  
• have decided not to attempt  
to reach bottom because of  
lack of time - Spanish occupation  
level seems to end with black  
midden zone
