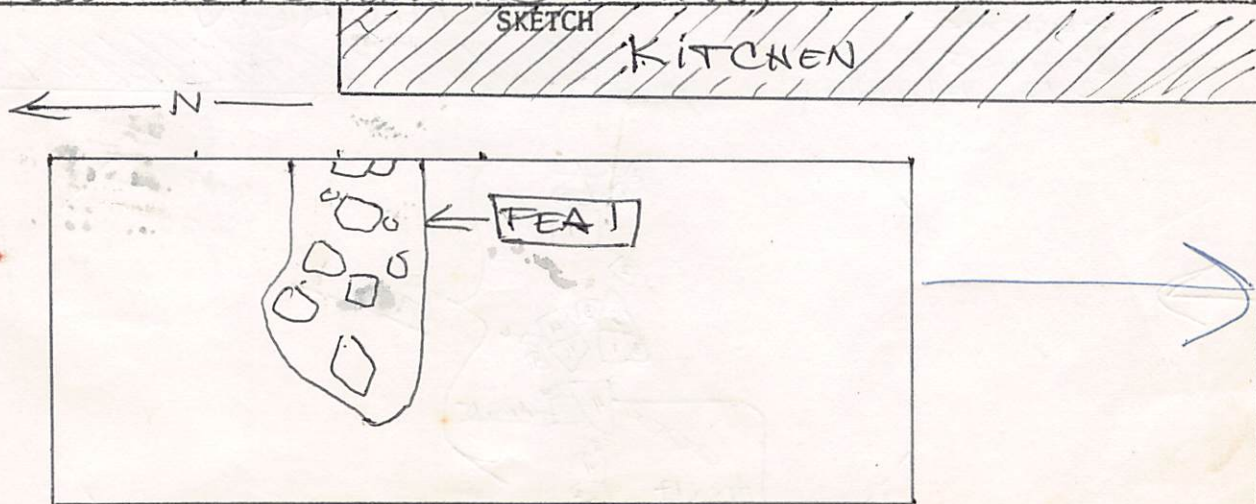

Comments: THIS FEATURE WAS FIRST NOTED AS A SMALL GROUP OF RUBBLE LYING NEXT TO THE EAST WALL OF THE SQUARE AREA 3 WHICH WAS CONSEQUENTLY REDESIGNATED FEAT 1. THIS FEATURE AT FIRST RESEMBLED A DETERIORATED FOOTING, BUT UPON CLOSER INVESTIGATION



Comments:

gation it is much too haphazard, blocks are too small & irregular to provide proper support. This feature could have been caused by pushing all the rubble lying loose within a standing structure up against the inside and/or outside of a wall, creating the linear formation. Regardless of the lack of clarity of this feature's function, it is evident that it does provide proof for the existence of a former structure.

After removing FEA 1 blocks, the soil directly beneath was screened & bagged in arbitrary 10cm levels designated FEA 1 / subsoil / levels 1 & 2. While removing level 2 of this subsoil, the center & eastern portions bottomed out after 2-3 cm onto a yellow mottled deposition which was included in Area 17.
